Keeping a pet Hedgehog

More and more people want to keep pets in recent years and the hedgehog is becoming more popular. But is it a good idea to keep a pet hedgehog?

There are no pet shops in Hong Kong that sell hedgehogs. The only way you can get one is to adopt it from somebody. Some owners have hedgehog babies to give away because hedgehogs give birth to three to five babies each time.

Hedgehogs live for three to five years. They are usually quiet, but they may disturb your sleep because they are active at night. You may hear them running around in their cages or on their exercise wheels.

Dr Lisa Mai tells us, 'Hedgehogs are wild animals, so they're not used to humans. They're easily frightened and often curl up into a ball. You need to play with them every day to help them get used to humans.'

'Some hedgehogs are very messy. You should wash the hedgehog using pet shampoo and a toothbrush whenever it's dirty. Hedgehogs can become fat easily, so you should feed them low-fat cat food and a little fruit,' says Dr Mai.

However, according to Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA), the hedgehog is not a good pet for Hong Kong.

Simon Ng, a representative from the SPCA, says, 'People think it's trendy to keep unusual pets, but many of them don't know that these animals need a lot of care and attention.'

Keeping an unusual pet can be fun, but it comes with responsibilities. Do think carefully before you bring a hedgehog home.

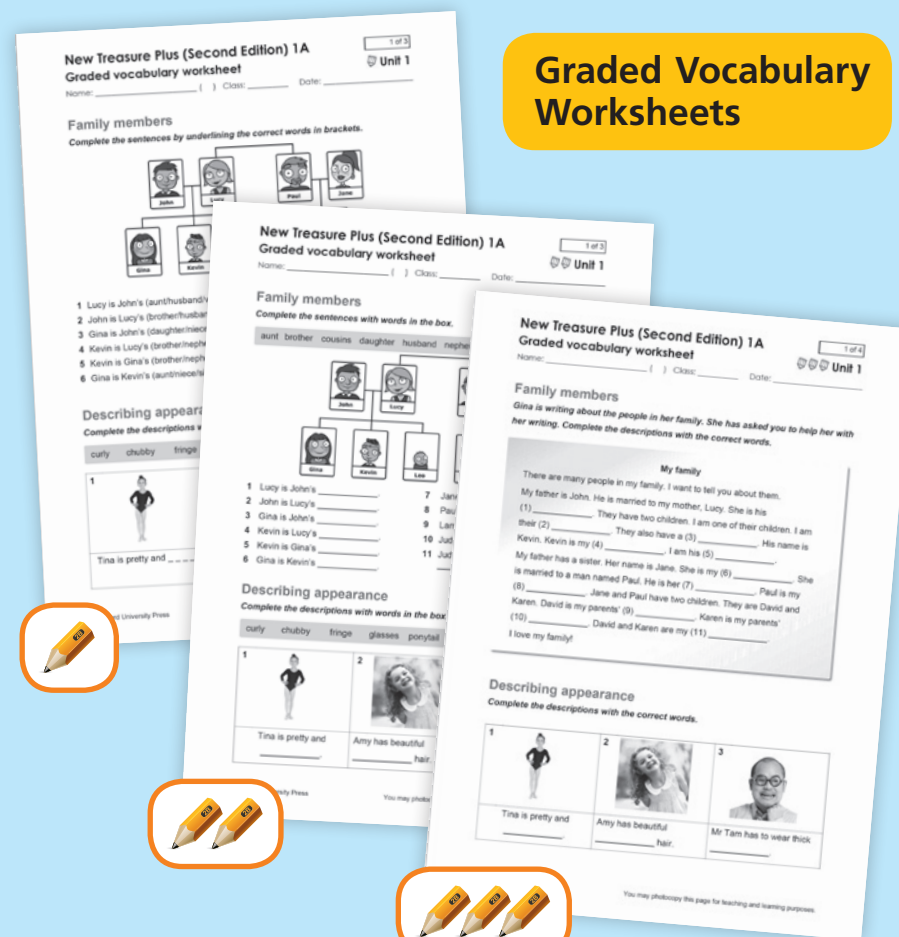
