 - After talking to her parents about it, Roisin cut off 23 cm of her hair, which was then donated to a charity called Little Princess Trust, which provides free wigs to children suffering from cancer. Roisin's small but kind act was soon noticed on social media and the news with many people praising the little girl for her kind heart. Roisin used the attention she received to raise money for another charity called BUMBLEance, which is a children's ambulance service that provides state-of-the-art medical equipment in an entertaining and fun atmosphere that makes children feel safer and more cheerful during a stressful time.
