An interview with

prop maker Timothy Leung

R = Reporter; L = Timothy Leung

- 1 R: What was your initiation into the world of prop making?
- L: It wasn't a straight path! I started out doing a Classical Art degree at university, because in my young mind, that was the only proper way to become an artist. One day, I realized that I'd rather build models than paint and draw. I found that I enjoyed constructing actual items much more than just creating pretty pictures. Luckily, the university was used to dealing with undecided students and let me stop that programme. It assisted me in transferring to a model-making degree instead. When I stepped into my first class, I knew that I was finally home. For one thing, building models came much more naturally to me, since I could actually touch the object I had pictured in my mind's eye.
- R: You started your career making weapons for a fantasy film, didn't you?
 - L: Yes. That was my big break. One day, I heard my colleague talking to a film director friend who needed some weapon props for a new fantasy film. He was working on an extremely tight budget and couldn't hire a professional. I thought to myself, 'This is your chance!' so I offered to make some swords and guns for him, free of charge. The director was so blown away by my creations that he started recommending me to his acquaintances in the film world. After that, I never looked back!

L: Sure. First, I get instructions from the art director, who has the overall vision for the project in mind. Then, he or she sets out the budget and production schedule. I learnt early on that adhering to spending limits and deadlines is extraordinarily important to film projects, since any minor delay affects everyone, and sometimes costs exorbitant amounts of money. Before I design a mould, I do a lot of research so that my props look realistic. This sometimes involves looking at history books, talking to professors, or even visiting a place in person. After that, I pour in the material and wait for it to set.

- **R:** Have you got any interesting stories about prop making?
 - L: Have you heard of the one about the flowers in one of the old Star Wars films? They used sprinkles as flowers on one of the planets. After a while, people noticed the flowers were moving. It turned out that ants were trying to carry them away!
- **R:** What would you change about your career, if you could change anything?
- L: This may sound ridiculous, but I would like to go back in time. Sometimes, I feel quite envious of prop makers who were able to work in the 1970s, when there weren't any 3D printers or CGI. In order to overcome obstacles, you had to be really creative, and being creative is what I love most about my work.

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
