Children in this country do not start school until they are seven years old. They do not need to do homework or tests until they are teenagers. Students of

25 different capabilities are taught in the same classroom. This means that they will not be judged by their performance at school. In fact, they only take one public exam when they are 16. 93% of Finnish students complete their secondary education.
