## A faithful friend

- ③ Sadly, John became ill with tuberculosis. This was a common disease at the time. Bobby whined as he heard John cough. The lung disease eventually ended John's life. However, this didn't end the strong bond between the dog and his master.
- ④ John was buried in Greyfriars Kirkyard. Bobby was at the funeral. He watched his best friend lay to rest. The distressed dog refused to leave Greyfriars Kirkyard afterwards. He stood faithfully on his four paws by John's grave. The gardener and the keeper often tried to chase the small dog away. However, they soon realized that was pointless. Bobby was never discouraged. He always returned.

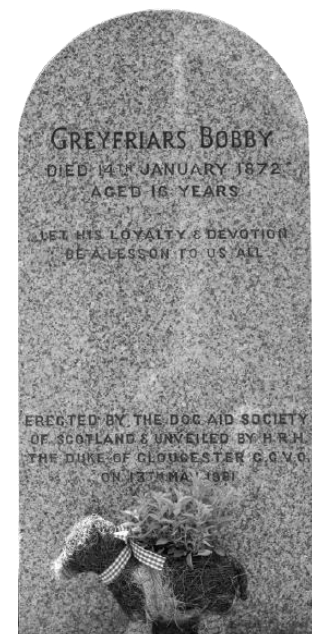

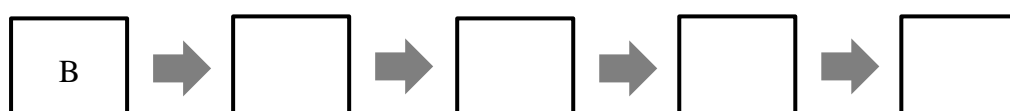
