

Ready Player One is a science fiction adventure film. Steven Spielberg produced and directed the film (1) so as to have complete creative control. The film was released in 2D, 3D, IMAX and IMAX3D, (2) so there were many mediums by which audiences could watch the film. Ready Player One starred Olivia Cooke and Tye Sheridan. It has grossed over USD 580 million. That's why it is the sixth-highest earning film in 2018.

The plot is set in the year 2045. In this dystopian future, people escape into virtual reality (3) so as to get away from their miserable existence in the real world. The owner of the virtual reality software, OASIS, creates a contest (4) so that he can find a successor to take over his business. The players must find a hidden 'Easter egg' in different quests. The main protagonist, Wade Watts (Sheridan), joins these guests (5) so as to compete for a chance to live a better life. He bands together with a player named Art3mis (Cooke) (6) so as to have a better shot at the prize. A large video game corporation also joins the contest (7) so that they can become even more powerful if they win the contest. There are countless challenges in the contest, (8) so all of the players must be careful.

Ready Player One is based on a science fiction novel of the same title, (9) so readers may feel familiar with the storyline. However, the screenwriters made some major changes (10) so that they could make the plot even more compelling. The special effects in this film are thrilling (11) so as to have the audience on the edge of their seats during the whole screening. A huge amount of investment was spent on this aspect of the film (12) so that audiences can enjoy a refreshingly new film-watching experience.

One downside is that the film relies heavily on pop culture references, (13) so if you didn't grow up in the 1980s, you may be left scratching your head at times. You might want to study the background of some old video games before you enter the cinema (14) so as to understand some of the jokes in the film. That said, the acting is terrific, (15) so it's acceptable to miss a few jokes. I will be following Olivia Cooke's career in order to see what she does in future films.

All in all, Ready Player One is an entertaining and exciting film that you can't miss! Watch it in 3D or IMAX3D (16) so that you can entirely immerse yourself in this sensational film!

We can't lose the Wildwood
