- When it comes to physical activity, technology can have even more direct advantages. Popular augmented reality games, played on mobile phones across the globe, require players to travel around in real life in order to progress in-game. Wearable technologies like
   fitness trackers were developed specifically with exercise in mind. They keep track of all kinds of data, including the number of steps taken per day as well as the user's heart rate and sleeping patterns. Such technologies greatly increase users' incentive to engage in physical activity, which might put the 'lazy' label to bed.
