Text 1 Essay

The enduring influence of William Shakespeare



- William Shakespeare is generally regarded as the greatest English language writer of all time. His numerous plays and poems, written in the late sixteenth and early seventeenth centuries, have endured for hundreds of years. Every year, theatre companies host festivals dedicated to the performance of Shakespeare's great works. No other playwright in history has had this level of influence. Shakespeare's famous storylines and delightful phrases have become so ingrained in the English language that we often do not even consider their origin. But a close examination reveals that we owe much more to this great writer than we realize.
- 2 Shakespeare was the master of word play. He coined countless words and phrases that have become part of our popular speech. Many of today's common expressions are actually Shakespearean creations. In the comedy *The Taming of the Shrew*, we find the first ever reference of the everyday phrases 'break the ice' and 'kill with kindness'. In the tragedy *Hamlet*, Shakespeare gives us the expressions 'in my heart of hearts' and 'in my mind's eye'. *Romeo and Juliet*
- 15 features the first use of the phrase 'wild goose chase', and *The Merchant of Venice* introduces the world to the classic saying 'love is blind'. The list goes on and on. The 20 Bard of Avon, as Shakespeare is
 - often referred to, had a truly magnificent ability to manipulate language.

3 However, it is not just Shakespeare's ingenious use of language that has endured through the ages. It is also his classic storylines, which appear over and over in books, television shows and films. Adaptations of Shakespeare's stories appear in all kinds of unexpected places. The Disney blockbuster *The Lion King*, for example, is actually based on Shakespeare's play *Hamlet*. Both stories centre on a young prince (Simba in *The Lion King* and the title character in *Hamlet*), whose father, the king, is murdered. Saddened by the death, the young prince seeks to find out who is responsible. In both cases, the murderer is the king's own brother who wants the throne for himself. Seeking to restore order to the kingdom, the young prince exposes the murderer.

4 Shakespeare's influence is also found in the famous musical West Side Story, which is directly inspired by the love story of 35 Romeo and Juliet. Written by Shakespeare in the 1590s, Romeo and Juliet tells the story of two young lovers born into rival families. Their forbidden love wreaks havoc on both of their families. West Side Story adapts this story to the streets of New York City in the twentieth century. The musical features two rival 40 gangs, the Jets and the Sharks. When a member of the Jets falls in love with a member of the Sharks, tragic problems arise.

5 The lasting impact of Shakespeare's works is hard to overstate. His plays continue to be performed on stages all over the world. Film 45 adaptations continue to be made—it seems like every few years a new version of a Shakespearean play lights up the screens of film houses. The bard's ability to play with language and his illuminating insights into human emotions have made this writer 50 an enduring treasure.
