### Sustainable development and



You may have heard the term 'sustainable development' used by politicians and corporate spokespersons, but what does it really mean? Sustainable development refers to a type of development that deals with the present needs of society, without spoiling the world for future generations.

Sustainable development requires a delicate balance between economic development and creativity and control to the control to the creativity environmental and social issues. In pursuit of a more self-sufficient city, we must also look at how urban areas collect and use water. With so many people living in urban areas, cities must find more sustainable methods of waste

With so many people living in urban areas, other must find more sustainable methods of waste management. Waste must be seen as a resource, rather than something to be discarded. Wastewater for example, can either be treated for irrigation or cleansed for use as drinking water.

Getting around cities should also become both easier and more sustainable in the future. If we want to open up more areas of our cities for pedestrians, private cars must become much less prevalent. Private cars can be replaced by more eco-friendly public transport such as high-speed rails and automated public transport systems.

Although some are concerned that future cities will be too compact and too deneely populated, with proper planning and design, this need not be a concern. With fewer cars outside and more plants inside, city life will become much more in harmony with nature. High-rise buildings will also be designed to make better use of our natural resources. Everyone will have unprecedented access to nature and any essential services, this improving our quality of living.
