Is space travel worth it?

1 If you're fascinated by space like I am, I'm sure you've thought about the possibility of travelling to space or even to Mars one day. This dream might become a reality very soon. Hundreds of wealthy people and celebrities have already reserved tickets to get a glimpse of outer space. But the question is, should we travel to space for leisure?

2 The first thing to think about is the cost. Tickets are currently being sold for around US\$250,000 each, which is roughly HK\$2 million. Why are they so expensive? That's because it is extremely costly to make a spacecraft. It also consumes a huge amount of fuel. In fact, NASA reported that one spacecraft costs US\$1.7 billion and one trip to space requires over 1.6 million pounds of fuel!

3 Environmental impact is another big concern. Rocket engines produce black carbon when they burn fuel, which is one of the substances that cause climate change. Fossil fuel vehicles like aeroplanes and cars may be the biggest polluters now, but space travel could double or triple the amount of pollution in the atmosphere.

4 Knowing its impact on the environment, I won't be ready to travel to space anytime soon. And it'd probably take years for me to save up for a ticket! For now, I think scientists need to consider the sustainability of space travel more seriously.

The impact of COVID-19 on our health

Since the **coronavirus pandemic** swept across the world in 2020, there has been a much greater emphasis in society on public health. However, many serious health problems were forced to take a back seat to the coronavirus pandemic. As a result, many of those problems have actually got worse. Let's look at some of them.

Type 2 diabetes is a chronic health condition which affects how your body turns food into energy. Obesity and being overweight are the biggest risk factors for developing diabetes, so it is a big problem in developed nations. In fact, it is estimated that one in ten US residents has diabetes. Due to lockdowns and a lack of exercise, diabetes cases might have exploded without notice.

Heart disease is another problem. This refers to a large spectrum of diseases related to the heart. It is the top leading cause of death in the US. Globally, COVID-19 caused significant disruptions in heart disease testing. In the US, deaths from heart disease increased by 4.8 per cent in 2020. It was speculated that many diagnoses were missed due to concerns about COVID-19.

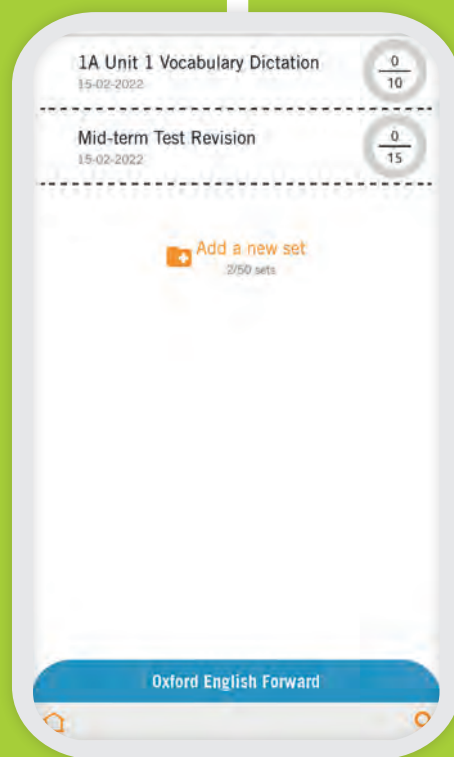
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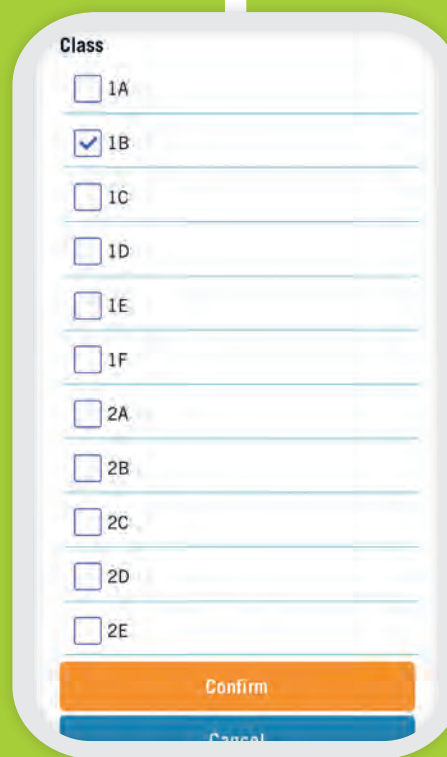
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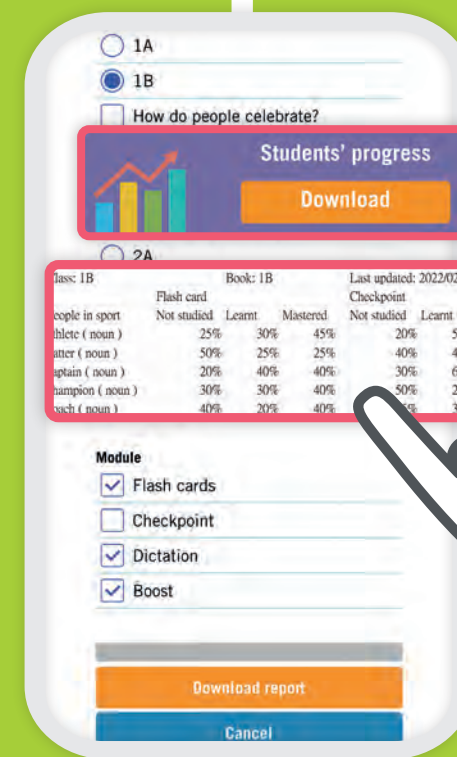
